Monitoring

- 2017-2018 will be the first year of monitoring under the new ESSA requirements for McKinney-Vento
- WDE has switched to risk-based monitoring
 - That means that rather than being monitored on a 3-year cycle, it is possible a district could be monitored every year
- WDE may increase monitoring for subgrant districts

Grant Application

- Switch from an annual grant to a 3-year grant
- Funding will continue to be tied to the end-of-year WDE-684
- All applicants must have a 25% match
- We will be looking more closely at community collaboration and outreach
- We will be adding new end-of-year reports for grant recipients
- A portion of the grant funding must be used for liaison training
- WDE plans to release the new application in late August/early September

 - Wyoming Homeless Collaborative Recommended Annually

Local Liaison Training


- Alternate training may be submitted to the State Coordinator for pre-approval
- Training Topics Must Include:
 - Understanding the McKinney-Vento Statute
 - Duties of the McKinney-Vento Liaison
 - Student Identification and Eligibility
 - Needs Assessment and Program Evaluation
 - Community Collaboration and Outreach
 - Trauma-Informed Strategies
 - Eliminating Barriers for Homeless Youth
 - Unaccompanied Homeless Youth

HOUSE BILL 159

- New Wyoming Homeless Minor Statute
- Goes into effect July 1, 2017
- Allows Unaccompanied Homeless Youth (aged 16 or 17) to acquire a signed affidavit verifying their UHY status
- Students can use the affidavit to access copies of their birth certificates, get driver's licenses, sign a lease, open a bank account, or purchase a car
- The affidavit must be signed by two adults from the following categories: an attorney, health care provider, rabbi, priest, minister, clergy, school counselor, college or school district official
- Pros/Cons
- The Affadavit
